



IDA and Membership Development



The Aim

An institution is known by its people and the service it renders to the community thus creating awareness of the importance of membership growth to serve the fraternity. The membership development goal clearly is to widen the membership base with a view to building a strong organization of dental professionals committed to the cause that IDA stands for. IDA aims at becoming a global knowledge centre that builds synergies between education, research, and dental enterprise. Towards this goal it has been working through its dual missions of excelling in education, research and service, at the same time fostering creativity, innovation and enterprise to aid the community and the fraternity. To realize this goal, it is essential to build a broader and stronger foundation with young and willing people who are always eager to carry the torch with a missionary zeal. The endeavour is to create and sustain an environment conducive to the growth and development of dental professionals in the country.

The membership development drive was motivated by the eagerness to put the Indian dental community on an equal footing with similar global institutions. Online Membership Registration

A new era of smooth and simple procedure of online registration has certainly led to an increase in membership and has done away with any hassles associated with the earlier membership procedures. With the facility of communication now being conducted in electronic language, the entire mechanism has now been made more member-friendly, smoother and simpler. Attractive privileges are on offer for the aspiring members which the member can avail of with the aid of IDA Membership card.



Membership Kit

As a part of the IDA outfit, a member is privileged to receive a Membership Kit on enrolment. This includes a Membership Card, Membership Certificate, two colourful Membership Stickers and Lapel Pins. The new Smart Card displays membership details like Registration Number, which remains permanent irrespective of a change in location or place, the State, Branch code, etc. The card with user ID can also be used for accessing our website: www.ida.org.in. The Membership Certificate reflects the commitment of IDA to dental excellence. The Lapel Pins are effective advertising and image building medium and serve as identification to other IDA members, medical professionals and patients. Better privileges and novel schemes are being planned as a part of the new membership development drive.

Value Added Privileges to Members

The IDA-Central Bank Credit Card offers to the IDA members a host of services covering CBI Medical Equipment Loans and Personal Loans besides collecting reward points and redeeming them.

A host of value added services and benefits can be enjoyed by IDA members, as in most international dental associations. An IDA member can become a participant and get involved in important national initiatives of IDA like SPOT and TII Centres, Child Development Centre, Educational Training Centres and CDE, Emergency Dental Centre, and the like. These avenues offer an opportunity to enhance their professional attainments.

Payment of annual subscription fee can now be made with the help of the card. Likewise, registration at State, National or International Conferences organized by IDA can be made at reduced rates as offered in case of FDI 2014. An IDA Member can become an ADA Member by paying only US \$12 instead of \$75.

The Enigma

The importance of active members in an organization of professional repute like the IDA cannot be gainsaid, inasmuch as it, besides projecting an enduring image, also enables IDA to derive its strength from its members. Considering the large number of dentist population in the country numbering nearly 200,000, the present membership strength leaves much to be desired. Opening of accounts by branches with State Bank of India has facilitated easy and speedier transfer of branch shares. These entire have, to a great extent, made IDA move forward. Branch expansion is an index of growth of an institution. Quite a few of branches have been established during the year under review. Members would be happy to know that during the year 8 new branches were opened. They were:




Student Membership










Clinical Dentistry

IDA and FDI 2014 **Annual World Dental Congres**

major activity of significance to the entire dental fraternity, in Amajor activity of significance to the sear under review general, and IDA in particular, during the year under review has been the hosting of the FDI Annual World Dental Congress. The Congress was held from 11 – 14 September, 2014 at the India Expo Centre and Mart, Greater Noida. 

The last day, Day 4, had an assortment of interesting lectures, from oral-systemic connection by Dr. Michael Glick to functional smile design by Dr. Sandesh Mayekar. A practice management session was jointly conducted by Dr. Rajeev Chitguppi (Perionomics) and Dr. Sujit Pardeshi (Soft Skills) before a packed house. Sessions on dental trauma and CBCT imaging also received a well deserved attention. Orthodontics for non-orthodontists was a hot topic, conducted by Dr. Girish Karandikar. Management of complications in daily dental practice by Dr. Rajiv Borle was an eventful discussion.

IDA and Oral Health Development Initiatives

"Dentistry is not expensive, neglect is; Smile, it lets your teeth breathe"



Members would not disagree with me that the dental healthcare service providers have a definite role to play in contributing to the national cause of improving oral health and hygiene in the country and thus improve general health of the people. In this connection, the various health initiatives undertaken to improve the oral and systemic health of the people such as National Oral Health Programme, Oral Cancer Foundation, National Oral Cancer Registry, Tobacco Intervention Initiative, Child Dental Centre, Emergency Dental Centre, the IDA Health Centre, to name only a few, assume considerable significance for oral healthcare management.

National Oral Health Programme

Members are well aware that, as custodian of oral health in the country, IDA has been greatly concerned about the obvious constraints in accessing oral care by the various segments of the population. To remedy the situation, a National Oral Health Programme has been initiated. It aims at improving access to oral healthcare and reducing disparities thereby contributing to the attainment of optimal oral health for all. It affirms that oral health is integral to general health and well-being.

The programme takes care of three segments of the population, viz., children, the family and the corporate personnel. To hasten the process, unique identification cards, i.e., the Child Oral

Health Card, the Family Oral Health Card and the Corporate Oral Health Card offering many oral health benefits to these categories of people, have been devised and designed which bestow a passport to sustaining oral health for a lifetime. National Oral Health Programme is a move towards building a stronger, effective and efficient oral healthcare system contributing to the health and wellbeing of everyone in the country. Cards offering many oral health benefits to children (Child Oral Health Card); adult (Family Oral Health Card), the elderly (Platinum Oral Health Card) the disabled (Special Privileged Oral Health Card) and the corporate staff (National Oral Health Card) have been designed under the National Oral Health Programme umbrella.

Members may be happy to know that during the year under reference numerous dental check up camps were organized to take care of oral health needs of children, adults, the elderly and the disabled, not to speak of the employees of the corporate sector. We are grateful to the authorities associated with these institutions for their cooperation and support in enabling IDA to offer oral care services to the community as a part of its social responsibility.

Dental Check-Up under National Oral Health Programme

During the year under review, activities such as free dental check-ups, community-based oral health camps and talks to generate oral health awareness were held as part of the agenda of activities under the programme. The dental check-up camps were as under:

For the Elderly

IDA organized a free dental check up camp for the senior citizen members of the Param Shantidham Vrudhashram in Taloja in Navi Mumbai as a part of IDA's National Oral Health Programme. A good number of 150 elderly persons availed of free dental check-up and were advised appropriate treatment. They were given Platinum Oral Health Card and passwords to enable them to view their reports online. The card will enable them to avail of necessary oral healthcare services taking advantage of 10 percent discount at the IDA certified dental clinics. Five patients were also given dentures free of charge.

For School Children

Schools are important institutions that facilitate provision of preventive oral and general healthcare programmes. The availability of children in large numbers in schools permits delivery of mass educative programmes in a convenient manner. A large number of children and parents have limited knowledge of the causes and prevention of the most common oral diseases. Similarly, the schoolteachers' oral health knowledge has also not been satisfactory.

School teachers can effectively influence student's knowledge, attitude and practices regarding oral health and can bring change in behaviour. It is very important to impart oral health education to the children since the lifestyle and hygiene practices once established at an early age can go a long way in spending rest of the life in a healthy way. The new programme heralds a novel approach in oral health education of children and school teachers



Activities such as free dental check-ups, distribution of samples of toothpaste and toothbrushes as well as educational leaflets and posters and large-scale community-based oral health camps are a part of the agenda of activities. During the year under review 16 free dental check-ups were held in as many as 12 schools from South Mumbai to Andheri in Mumbai covering 13000 students. Following dental check up, the children were given treatment plans for further treatment, wherever necessary. Needless to say, all these children are proud owners of child oral health card.

For Corporate Staff

Members would be happy to know that during the current year, under this pioneering activity of NOHP, oral health check up of employees of four establishments was carried out in four locations - Bangalore, Gurgaon, Hyderabad and Mumbai. In all 159 patients underwent oral health check up from these locations. Employees who had oral problems availed of the services provided and were advised of the importance of regular dental visits for oral care.

These oral health examinations were preceded by lectures by dental professionals to make the employees become familiar with the importance of maintaining oral health and hygiene. In essence, these are expected to produce multiplier effects in



their own families and neighbourhood, besides providing a boost to the professional practice of members. Corporate staff that undergo dental checkups are provided "Corporate Oral Health Card" containing the logos of IDA and the corporate house concerned. They were given the password to facilitate viewing the report online and the National Oral Health Card that will facilitate them to gain 10% discount on further treatment.

We appreciate the interest evinced by members to participate in this programme which, we have reasons to believe, would go a long way in bringing about perceptible changes in the oral health scenario in the country.

Corporate employees, who want to avail of dental services provided under the scheme, can click on the Dentists' Directory created to identify and locate a dentist participating in the programme and take an appointment online or on phone to visit the clinic later for treatment. Use of the card entails the person a 15% discount for dental treatments carried out.

Special Privilege Dental Check Up

It may interest you to know that a special privilege dental check up camp was organized for mentally retarded, physically disabled as also for the blind during the year. The 6 camps conducted for the purpose covered 535 patients in Mumbai at four locations.











Community Dental Check Up

Members may be happy to know that under the NOHP banner, quite a few community camps numbering nine were held during the year in different locations covering 1930 patients.



Rural Dental Check Up

In our thrust to the rural areas, IDA was able to organize only four dental check up camps in the rural areas covering 450 patients. The activities under NOHP had a low coverage this year owing to the staff being busy with FDI Congress. We hope to pick up momentum in the years ahead.



Oral Cancer Foundation



The global incidence of oral cancer has been rising, more so in India. Mortality from the disease remains high and survival has not improved in the last 30 years. According to a World Health Organization

survey report, India ranks first in the world in oral cancer. As custodian of oral health in the country, IDA had been very much concerned about addressing the disease and its major causative factor, i.e., tobacco habit, to improve the oral health environment.

Members might recall that the establishment of the Oral Cancer

Foundation for early detection and treatment was aimed at creating an 'oral cancer free' nation. Facilities are being created for early detection and treatment to aid prevention and reduce mortality, besides educating the masses of the risk factors.

Members are aware that an Oral Cancer Registry to exclusively register the number of oral cancer cases in the country has been set up for compilation and assimilation of research data on oral cancer as well as to facilitate conduct of oral cancer research in the country. These together marked the beginning of a new era in safeguarding the oral health of people through early detection and treatment

SPOT Centres

Members are aware that Spot, Prevent Oral-cancer Trauma (SPOT) Centre is IDA's initiative under the aegis of Oral Cancer Foundation (OCF) for early detection of oral malignancy and potentially malignant lesions. SPOT Centres constitute a

significant tool at reducing the incidence of oral cancer through early detection and treatment. The SPOT Centres also facilitate research by providing patient data.



Members would be happy to know that a small beginning has been made in the setting up of SPOT Centres. There are currently 62 such Centres in operation in 19 States and 2 Union Territories across the country.

IDA is keen on creation of a band of trained dental healthcare providers to man clinics certified as SPOT Centres for early detection and treatment. The idea is to establish more and more SPOT Centres across the country to make detection of precancerous lesions and counselling for prevention accessible to a larger number of persons.

A minimally expensive, formal one day training is imparted to all those dental/healthcare professionals desirous of starting a SPOT Centre to create a class of professionals providing effective oral cancer service and education. The training equips them with the technique of carrying out detection of oral cancer lesion and the subsequent biopsy to strengthen their oral cancer prevention and detection service. Three training camps were organized one each in February, July and December during the year in which a total of 110 dentists participated.

The SPOT Centres have the necessary facilities required for

detection of oral cancer, besides trained dentists specialised in oral cancer examinations, and to identify patients who use tobacco and alcohol and counsel them about their risk for cancers. The SPOT Centres thus combine both the tobacco cessation service and oral cancer detection. Setting up of SPOT Centres provides an opportunity to not only earn credibility but also involve the healthcare providers in the battle against oral cancer and tobacco cessation as a service to the nation.

IDA would welcome dental professionals to be a part of its noble initiative by registering themselves for the initial training in early detection and treatment and to get their clinics certified as SPOT Centres. The idea is to make detection of precancerous lesions and counselling for prevention accessible to a larger number of persons by establishing SPOT Centres across the country.

Tobacco Intervention Initiative



As reported earlier, the Tobacco Intervention Initiative (TII) Centres, as effective tools for oral healthcare management, are being set up in various states by dentists trained in behavioural counselling, medication and nicotine replacement therapy. Members would be happy to know that so far nearly 756 TII Centres

have become functional in various states and union territories. The setting up of TII Training Centres by IDA by utilising the services of trained personnel to impart training to dentists in their own respective states has paid rich dividends going by the growing number of TII Centres in the country.

During the year under review, as many as 64 participants have been trained and there are 46 pending registrations for training which are being speeded up. We are hopeful of covering over 1000 Centres shortly.



Establishment of TII and SPOT Centres brings to the members the wonderful opportunity of providing enhanced services to your patients and to broaden your reach to the community. In fact, these Centres give you a platform, not just to gain knowledge, but also to get specialized training in oral cancer detection and tobacco de-addiction from the best in the field by registering your clinic as SPOT and TII Centres for oral cancer detection, behavioural counselling and nicotine replacement therapy. The interest and enthusiasm displayed by members in being a participant in this national cause deserve appreciation.

Child Dental Centre



Members would be happy to know that the Child Development Centres being set up have been showing encouraging response. There are over 67 Child Development Centres set up so far covering 20 states and one Union


Territory in the country since its launch. Though slow, the CDCs are gradually picking up momentum and vigorous marketing would ensure greater spread of CDCs across the country.

Members would agree with me that CDCs assume considerable importance particularly in the context of the new launch of "Cavity Free Future" at FDI Congress 2014. Maharashtra state leads the list with 18 centres followed by Uttar Pradesh with 6. The next best performers are Gujarat with 5, while Bihar and Kerala have 4 each.

Dental Practice Accreditation

Members are aware that IDA intends to usher in a new era in dental practice at par with international standards. The broad objective of dental practice accreditation is to standardise and improve the practice of dentistry in the country. It provides benchmarks for excellence to render high quality of care. It's IDA's endeavour to represent and better serve its fellow dentists by certifying their clinics accredited if their clinics fulfil the norms and quality standards of oral healthcare. Efforts are on in this regard and we hope to launch the project in the coming year. With dental practice accreditation IDA hopes to provide a standardised dental healthcare system ensuring delivery of superior, current and internationally accepted treatment modalities while at the same time safeguarding the rights of both patients and dentists.

Members' Profile



Members would be happy to know that your association has instituted an award for achievements in dental excellence. It's an award conferred on a member in recognition of his services to the community, in particular, and the profession, in general.

A web platform for members to meet and know each other and recognize the potential of others, their achievements and personal status has been developed. Categorised as 'Profile of the Month' the choice of the winner is made purely on

an objective assessment of the comprehensive information submitted via the curriculum vitae of members uploaded every month during a specific period. Selection of the CV for online voting by members is based on academic excellence and the nature of services rendered. 

They provide the complete solution for patient education at the point of care. Minimally priced, the brochures can be utilised by the patients, dental clinics, hospitals, community health centres, polyclinics, and health insurance management. These oral health brochures can be effectively utilized not only by the patients, but by students, academicians and even those dentally discerned.

I am very happy to inform you that the response to these brochures has been extremely overwhelming and, in the wake of growing interest for them, effective measures are being taken to comply with increasing demands. Members would agree that the patient education brochures would go a long way in enhancing the clinical practice of members as also developing communication channels and longstanding bond of trust between the patients and the dental healthcare service providers.

Continuing Education Programme

"The Solitary Solution to Professional Advancement"

ental education calls for frequent review in order to most appropriately address community needs consistent with the rapidly changing technology. To meet this ever growing needs of dental professionals, IDA has been assembling some of the best minds in contemporary dentistry, tracking latest advancements and most innovative techniques to aid clinical practice. Continuing education provides updates on new knowledge, besides new knowledge in specific areas; introduction to new skills and techniques; solutions to problems in dental care and alterations in delivery of healthcare to enhance the quality of oral care service to the community.

Accredited Continuing Dental Education Programmes

Globalisation of dental science has made it essential for every practising and teaching dental professional to look around and understand the technological changes happening around them to widen their knowledge and update their clinical skills. Towards this end, IDA has been planning, conceiving, organizing as well as conducting Accredited Continuing Dental Education Programmes (ACDEP) aimed at encouraging and assisting the dental professionals to achieve higher levels of skills and knowledge to continually provide an improved level of care. Besides earning credit points, which are significant value-additions to the basic qualification, it helps professional advancement as well.

A series of CDE programmes, Webinars were organized during the year to keep dental practitioners abreast of the latest technological changes in dental science. Highlights of some of these are, as under:

Crown Club - M/s Reddy's Laboratory

Geographical spread of the country demands exploring newer ways to serve the community. Hence, in association with M/s Reddy's Laboratory, a distance learning programme in three modules, titled 'Crown Club' was carried out. The content development and logistic arrangements were taken care of by M/s Bioquest Solutions Pvt. Ltd. Dental Excellence Programme



Emergency Dental Centres

Members are aware that IDA had taken the initiative of launching a 24-hour service to provide reliable dental care to the people as and when they need. Emergency Dental Care (EDC) a novel concept at offering steady, reliable and uninterrupted dental service throughout the week has had encouraging response. Members would certainly agree that such a service undoubtedly goes a long way in providing successful dental practice every dentist yearns for and in improving dental care and the oral health scenario in the country. With right ambience, tools and equipment, coupled with dedicated and responsive staff, EDCs would facilitate in offering high quality service to the patients.

Members would be happy to know that there are at present as many as 310 Emergency Dental Centres in operation in various states across the country. Maharashtra (87), Tamil Nadu (29) and Gujarat (28) lead the states in setting up EDCs. Members from the North Eastern States, barring Assam, are conspicuous by their absence. Going by the good number of enquiries being received by your Association the potential for expansion is good. Dental professionals who participate in this innovative social scheme will be given a monogram which they can stick at their clinic as a mark of certification by IDA. EDCs are listed in the area-wise search list wherein patients in need of such care can easily locate them in their nearest areas for any emergency dental care.

World No Tobacco Day



'World No Tobacco Day' is a' global initiative designed to raise awareness of the harmful health effects of tobacco use and to induce people to eschew tobacco products to live a healthier life. The 'World No Tobacco Day' is being observed all over the world on 31 May every year. 'Bright Smiles Bright Futures Programme'

Dental caries is the most common oral disease among children leading to tooth decay, causing pain, absence from school, and loss of confidence. Sadly, many children do not have access to basic dental care and the education needed to maintain good oral health. IDA-Colgate 'Bright Smiles Bright Futures Programme' (BSBF) is a massive national oral health education initiative that addresses this need by stressing on the importance of preventive oral care amongst school children. It's aimed at





inculcating preventive self-care habits among children from an early age as a part of oral health care. It may not be out of place to mention that IDA-Colgate partnership now into its 40th year has been singularly responsible for improving oral health awareness and oral hygiene practices among children, in particular, and public at large.

Under this programme, children in primary schools receive instructions in dental care from members of the dental profession nominated by the Indian Dental Association. Oral health education is imparted with the aid of audio-visuals and printed literature. Free dental health care packs, including samples, are also distributed to encourage good oral hygiene. Some of the components of BSBF programme include (a) school dental health education with the aid of charts and audio visuals (b) teachers training to impart oral health and hygiene in children and (c) demonstration of correct brushing techniques.

This special School Contact Programme reaches out to primary school children in disseminating the message of basic oral care and hygiene to maximize the impact. Over 100 IDA branches spread over 23 states in the country volunteered the time and skills of their dentists to educate school children about the basics of oral hygiene such as proper brushing techniques and good dietary habits. This unique annual programme covered 2 million school children between 6 and 12 years of age across 5000 schools in the country. To sustain the message, special Teachers' Training and Parent's Orientation Programmes are being organized. Colgate provided logistic support including teaching aids and education materials as well as special dental health kits. Through partnerships with governments, dental professionals, schools and community groups, BSBF programme increases oral health awareness and promotes good oral care habits. A lifetime of healthy habits, growing self-esteem, a foundation for success - that's what the power of a Bright Smile is.

IDA COLGATE 'Oral Health Month' PROGRAMME

Members are aware that, on a privileged association with Colgate, IDA has been observing the Oral Health Month every year for the past over eleven years. Oral Health Month, a remarkable annual

mass contact programme, conceived and initiated jointly by IDA and Colgate, is a unique, large scale nationwide awareness drive. Spanning two months - October and November - the two-month long awareness drive was aimed at creating a "Cavity Free Future". In essence, the programme this year was focused on educating people across the country about the importance of oral care leading to the goal of zero cavities. On its eleventh year, it got off to a splendid start on October 1 and concluded on 31 November this year. The oral care initiative aims to create nationwide oral health awareness to combat cavities and instil the importance of good oral hygiene through free dental checkups to dawn a 'cavity-free' era in the future.



The focus is on awareness generation and educating people about the need for good oral care and hygiene as also to make the dental facilities available to everyone. The oral health awareness related initiative was to highlight the importance of oral health, in particular, and overall health, in general. Over 35000 IDA dentists participated in the two month long awareness drive to combat cavities and instil the importance of good oral hygiene. Driving the campaign were the free public in-clinic dental check-ups in over 1300 cities and 45 towns covering schools, housing societies and under-privileged areas offering free cavity check-ups. Use of mobile dental vans reaching out to cover the underprivileged areas to offer free dental check-ups was a feature of the programme.

The outreach events of Oral Health Month 2014 included free public dental check-ups in city clinics and also camps at other centres. The Oral Health Month 2014 programme was aimed at conducting dental checkups for people, college and school students, housewives and traders across various locations. Information on the right way of brushing and timely dental checkups was also disseminated. A notable feature of the programme was the participation of celebrities from the film world, viz., Kareena Kapoor Khan, Sonam Kapoor, Allu Arjun and Kajal Aggarwal who were involved in taking the 'Cavity Free Future' pledge to encourage families to benefit from the free dental check-up provided during OHM and adopt good oral hygiene for a 'Cavity Free Future'.

Oral Health Month 2014 was supported by a fully integrated 360 degree marketing campaign encompassing TV, digital and onground activities to increasingly encourage families to take the pledge for a 'cavity-free future'. OHM campaign reached out to consumers through kiosks put up in modern retail environments through tie ups with 4 retail chains. As members are aware, one of the important components of Oral Health Month 2014 public dental check up activity was the use of Mobile Vans to carry

out dental checkups and to have better rural outreach. The mobile vans equipped with the necessary logistics were in use in 45 cities and towns across the country carrying out 351310 checkups. Through this initiative it reached out to the masses that have limited access to dental care and need to be taught the importance of good oral hygiene.

Central to the Oral Health Month is the accent on awareness generation about the need for good oral care and hygiene. The Programme extended its coverage from September through October for greater accessibility and availability of the dental check up facilities to everyone over a longer period. The intensive two month-long oral health awareness campaign became a leading campaign for establishing and promoting improved oral health habits in India. IDA is grateful to Colgate for the manner in which the whole Programme was organized and to our members for extending support for the conduct of free dental check-ups.

IDA Colgate Future Dental Professionals Programme

Providing help at hand to budding dentists by keeping them informed of various options available for them so that they can take informed decisions in shaping up individual careers was the underlying principle in the programme. In the series, seven programmes were organised at Pune, Indore, Lucknow, Ghaziabad, Hyderabad, Chennai and Nagpur.

IDA-Colgate Online CDE Programme



Report on CDE Activities 2014

Dear Colleagues

I am pleased to present the report on Continuing Dental Education activities during the year under review.

According to CDE Regulations approved by the Dental Council of India and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, all registered dental surgeons are to obtain 100 credit points over a period of five years calculated at 20 credit points of CDE per year. It will be essential to achieve a minimum of 15 and a maximum of 25 points a year. At the same time, 10 points for asepsis and infection control and 5 points for dental jurisprudence over a period of 5 years are mandatory.

In keeping with these regulations, and to assist our members, IDA has been organizing CDE programmes for their benefit. The CDE Programme reflected IDA's commitment to professional advancement of its members and delivery of quality service to the community.

I am very happy to present to you our report on CDE activities conducted during the year

Under the IDA-Colgate sponsored CDE Programmes, 165 branches - 17 State and 148 Local – conducted 480 programmes ranging from one to a maximum of six programmes. In all 37 branches conducted the maximum number of CDE programmes. There were 183 local and 12 state branches which did not conduct any programme.

I take this opportunity to gratefully acknowledge the cooperation and support received from all concerned at IDA HO, State and Local Branches for the successful conduct of the CDE programmes.

- 3. Fixed Assets are depreciated on written down basis at the rates prescribed as per Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 4. Details of Life Members admitted during the year are pending for reconciliation with the amount of Life Membership fees received. Hence, we are unable to comment on the correctness of Life Membership Fees shown under the head "Subscription" in the Income and Expenditure Account of Life Members Account.
- The Outstanding Balance in respect of Closing Loans and Advances, Deposit, Investment, is subject to confirmation, reconciliation and adjustment, if any.
- 6. All the expenses are authorized and approved by the Trustees / Committees.
- 7. Figures are rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
- 8. Previous year's figures are regrouped and / or reclassified, wherever necessary, to make them comparable.




